KEY CONCEPTS

- ➤ Creation of MSTU will have no impact on County's role relative to regional communications infrastructure
- Charter obligations will continue to be fulfilled
- Regional communications infrastructure interlocal agreement responsibilities will continue to be met
- Closest unit response and radio system interoperability continue to be high priority goals
- > MSTU relates solely to call taking and dispatch functions

MSTU - SUMMARY OF F.S. 125.01

- A county governing body may create a MSTU by ordinance for any part or all of the unincorporated area of the county for essential municipal services such as fire protection, law enforcement, etc.
- ➤ The boundaries of a MSTU may include all or part of the boundaries of a municipality if the municipality consents by ordinance either annually or for a term of years
- ➤ The millage levied on any parcel of property for municipal purposes by all MSTUs and the municipality may not exceed 10 mills
- ➤ The Board of County Commissioners shall be the governing body of any MSTU created pursuant to 125.01(q)

IMPLICATIONS OF MSTU FOR COUNTY

Separate line on TRIM Notice— line would include county phone number and public hearing information

➤ Amount of millage would count toward the unincorporated area 10 mill cap

IMPLICATIONS OF MSTU FOR MUNICIPALITIES

- Two step process
 - Ordinance provides basic parameters (may require two readings)
 - Interlocal agreement provides details
- ➤ Tight timeframe to opt into MSTU may require special scheduling efforts
 - Municipalities could proceed with MSTU ordinance immediately since ordinance would not be effective until agreement is signed
- Amount of millage would count towards the 10 mill cap of municipal participants
- All MSTU participants will have a uniform millage rate applied toward their cap

COUNTY MSTU ORDINANCE

- ➤ Agenda item for <u>April 2, 2013</u> will set public hearing for <u>April 23, 2013</u> to adopt
- ➤ Ordinance will create the MSTU for the unincorporated area and allow for Municipalities to opt in via passage of an ordinance and interlocal agreement
- ➤ Deadline for Municipalities to opt in for FY14 will be May 10, 2013

MSTU INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

- A standard interlocal agreement will be developed and recommended for approval by County Commission on <u>April 23, 2013</u>
- Deadline for interlocal agreement from Municipalities will be May 10, 2013
- Interlocal agreement will address the following issues:
 - Description of Services to be provided
 - ➤ Maximum TRIM millage rate for FY14 for MSTU
 - > 60/40 annual funding split between County and Municipalities
 - ➤ Process for finalizing FY14 budget and millage rate
 - Process for development of future years budget and millage rate

MSTU INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT Cont'd

- ➤ Creation of operational committees
- ➤ Operational and efficiency performance standards for operation of the regional system
- > Transitional items for County and Municipalities
- > Exempt MSTU from CRA payments

SOME COUNTY TRANSITION ITEMS

- ➤ Negotiate lease agreements for space for up to three regional dispatch centers
- Conduct an inventory of current call taking and dispatch personnel to finalize budget
- Finalize the operating cost of the system
- ➤ Place the necessary equipment in the appropriate dispatch centers for the regional system
