I wish to extend my personal appreciation as well as that of the Department for your contribution toward the outstanding effort made by "Team 6" during the visit of Pope John Paul II. This effort was a monumental task that required effective coordination and cooperation among many people and the success of the event demonstrated clearly that this District is truly a "Team."

The many months of planning and coordination led by our District Traffic Operation's Engineer, Frank DeLuca, with the support of our Maintenance, Traffic Operations, Construction and Maintenance of Traffic offices proved unquestionably effective. The efforts of Maintenance crews assigned to sprucing up the appearance of the various roadways used for motorcade routes resulted in them looking as good as the day they originally opened. Construction personnel and permits engineers dealt effectively with contractors to ensure that the high volumes of traffic predicted would not be impacted by roadway work. The U.S. Coast Guard and our bridgetenders were brought into this effort to ensure minimum disruptions due to bridge openings. Many of our employees spent time on the telephone providing helpful information regarding road closures to the public.

During the two days of the event, the Department of Transportation did business as a true transportation operating agency. Efficient traffic management and control was accomplished during the closure and reopening of five major urban expressways by our personnel. The significance of this accomplishment is great especially considering it was conducted in a major U.S. city during an event of national importance. Further benefit to the system was provided by our Incident Response Teams sent out to provide assistance to stranded motorists and by our Diversion Route Patrols and helicopter surveillance for reporting in on traffic conditions, buildups, incident status, etc. The communications between the field units, maintenance yards, Emergency Operations Center and Command Posts were excellent. Overall, one word describes the combined effort of all involved - **MAGNIFICENT!**
