FIELD PERMIT PURSUANT TO SECTION 161.053 or 161.052, FLORIDA STATUTES

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW: The request for a permit was considered by the staff designee of the Department of Environmental Protection and found to be in compliance with the requirements of Chapter 62B-33, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.). Approval is specifically limited to the activity in the stated location and by the project description, approved plans (if any), attached standard conditions, and any special conditions stated below pursuant to Paragraph 161.053(5), Florida Statutes. This permit may be suspended or revoked in accordance with Section 62-4.100, F.A.C.

PROJECT LOCATION: 2014 Project Courage 5K Ruck Run beach from Sheridan St. (Hollywood North Beach Park) to Dania Beach Fishing Pier at DEP R-MON: BO R-107 0000/0000 to BO R-098 50300/50300

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: A single day event, The 2014 Project Courage 5K Ruck Run, is to be held on 26 April 2014. The run/walk is to begin at 2000 hours and end at the finish of the last competitor (around 2100 hours). The course is to start just south of the Dania Beach Pier and continue south for 1.55 miles to a turn around point just north of Sheridan St. and then return north to the pier. No overnight construction or set up will occur and all event activity will be conducted in accordance w/the attached special event permit conditions. A 3'x10' timing mat and three risers will be included as part of set up on the sandy beach and removed following completion of

SPECIAL PERMIT CONDITIONS: This permit is valid only after all applicable federal, state, and local permits are obtained and does not authorize the contravention of local setback requirements or zoning or building codes. This permit and public notice shall be posted on the site immediately upon event issuance and shall remain posted along with local approval until the completion of any activity authorized by this permit. Other special conditions of this permit include:

All event activity shall be conducted in accordance with the attached special event permit conditions for marine turtle protection. Event activity shall not alter current dune topography or damage any existing vegetation. No overnight construction/set up shall occur and all temporary structures must be removed off of the sandy beach immediately following completion of the event.

STANDARD PERMIT CONDITIONS: The permittee shall comply with the attached standard field permit conditions.

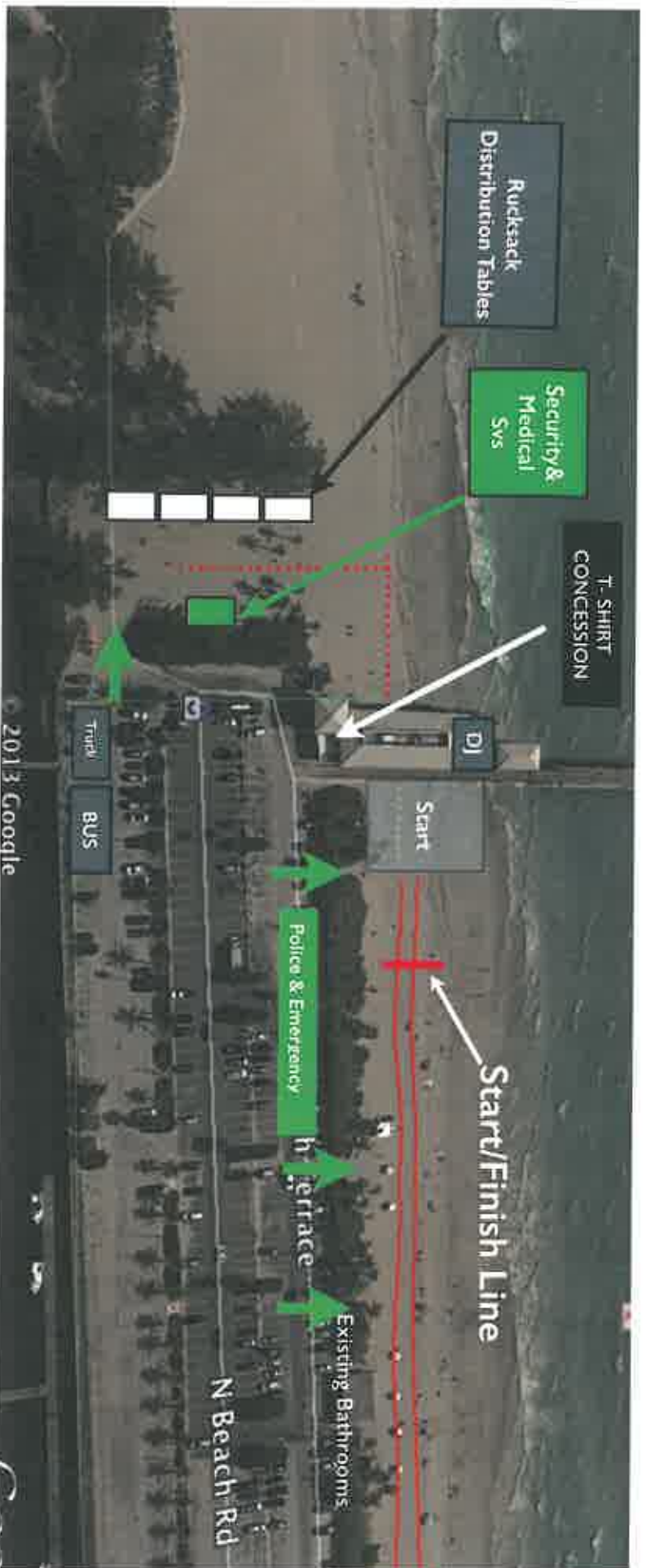

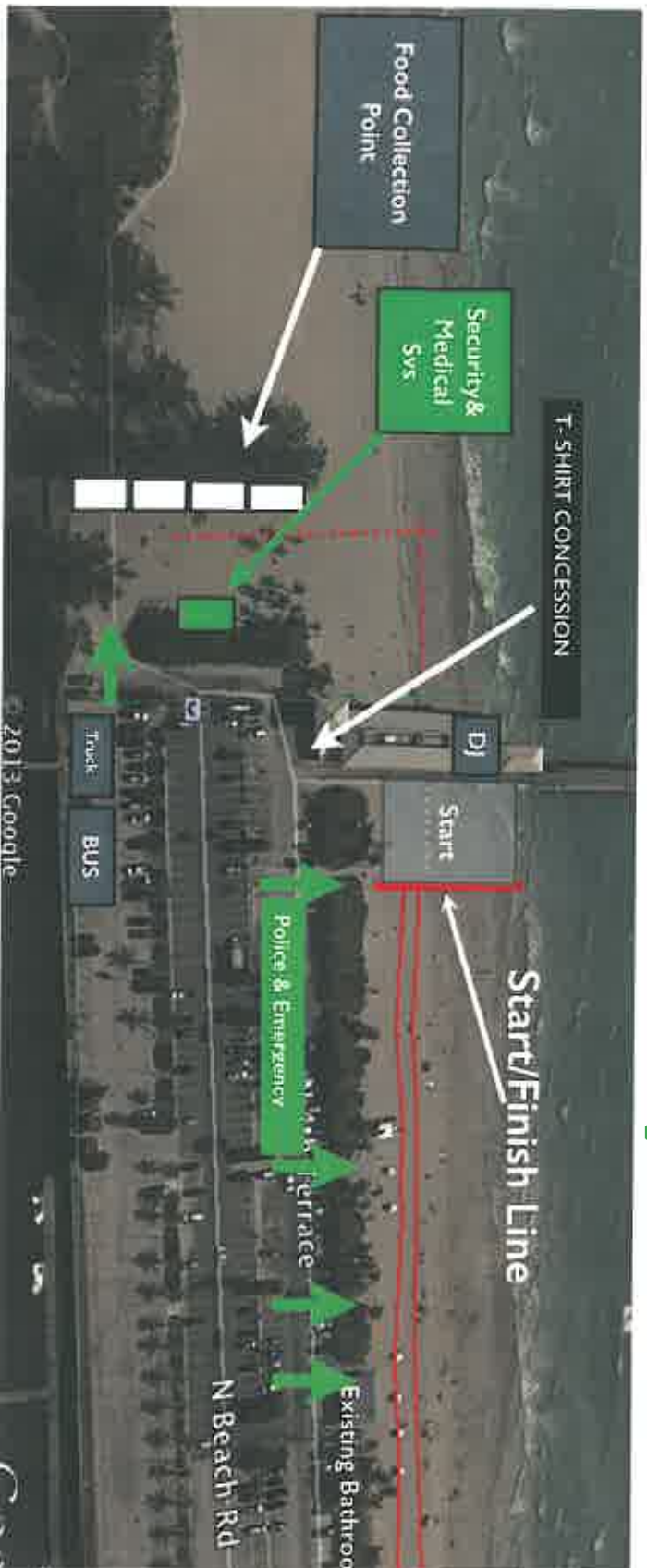
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Post Race Site Plan

Project Courage 5k Ruck Run

When: April 26th, 2014 @ 2000hrs (8pm)

Where: Dania Beach & Hollywood Beach, Florida

Why: To benefit Project Courage, Team Red, White & Blue, H.E.L.O., Broward Navy Days (Fleet Week), Special Operations Warrior Foundation and local food banks.

What: All entrants will be provided with a ruck sack, 20 pounds of food (rice, corn flour, beans, etc), a red glowstick attached to the ruck sack and a bottle of water.

There will be no water station on the course.

Entrants will run/walk a 5k course (1.55miles south from the Dania Beach Pier) to approximately Sheridan Street and return to the pier.

Every half mile we would have 200 feet of green glow cord held by four volunteers who will also have green glow sticks. Entrants are to keep green on their left northbound and south bound.

At the turnaround point a 3'x10' mat will be laid out in the sand. Entrants will cross the panel to insure they all run/walk the same distance.

At the end of the race all entrants will deposit the food in bins for the local food bank(s) and keep the rucksack.

SPECIAL EVENT PERMIT CONDITIONS FOR MARINE TURTLE PROTECTION Field Permit No. -8029378

1. The following conditions are required for special events for the protection of marine turtles during the marine turtle nesting season. The nesting season is March 1 – October 31 in Brevard, Indian River, St. Lucie, Martin, Palm Beach, and Broward counties, and is May 1 – October 31 in all other coastal counties in Florida. **The Project Courage 5k Ruck Run/Walk will be held on 26 April 2014 starting at 2000hrs (8pm) and finishing roughly around 2100hrs (9pm). Course will start adjacent to the southside of the Dania Beach Pier and proceed 1.55 miles south on the beach into Hollywood Beach just north of Sheridan Street and then return to the Dania Pier.**

2. All structures proposed to be constructed in marine turtle nesting habitat and left out overnight shall have 3 feet of vertical clearance beneath them, at least 7 feet of horizontal clearance between the supports where they meet the beach, and shall be located as far landward as possible. Any structures or materials not meeting these criteria must be removed by sundown each day. All staging and storage of event equipment and materials shall be off the beach. **NO structures will be constructed overnight on the course. However a timing mat approximately 3'x10' will be laid down on the sand at the turnaround point just south of Sheridan Street on the beach. It will be put into place at 1930hrs and taken up when the last entrant crosses it. Three risers will be put into place on the beach at the ramp leading**

up to the Dania Beach pier at 1930hrs and taken down immediately after the awards presentation.

3. The use of heavy equipment is prohibited, and the use of street vehicles to transport event equipment is prohibited except on beaches where public beach driving is allowed by local ordinance. A lightweight, ATV-type vehicle with 10 p.s.i. or less ground-to-tire pressure may be used for equipment transport if allowed by local ordinance. Use of vehicles shall be minimized, and restricted to event set-up and break-down. The only vehicles will be two lightweight ATV vehicles to first survey the course during daylight hours for any nesting sites that might be on the course. Secondly to serve as emergency pickup for any entrant that is having difficulties and to collect any debris left on the beach.

4. In order to place structures on the beach, surveys for marine turtle nesting activity must be ongoing, and have been conducted daily for 65 days previous to the event date or since the beginning of marine turtle nesting season in accordance with the following conditions:

a. All nesting surveys shall be conducted by qualified persons who hold a valid marine turtle permit issued by the FWC pursuant to Florida Administrative Code Rule 68E-1. No materials or equipment may be set up on the beach until the applicant has coordinated with the marine turtle permit holder. We do not know who the Marine Turtle Permit Holder will be in Broward County for the period of our event. But whoever it is we would like to have a representative present before, during and after the event to insure we are in compliance with all the codes.

b. It is the responsibility of the permittee to ensure that the project area and access sites are surveyed daily for marine turtle nesting activity and all nests occurring in the project area are marked for protection. The permittee must arrange for a Marine Turtle Permit Holder who is duly authorized to conduct such activities on that beach through a valid permit issued by the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC), pursuant to Florida Administrative Code 68E-1, to conduct all nesting surveys and nest protection work and shall convey the following requirements to the Marine Turtle Permit Holder who has agreed to conduct nest marking for this activity.

c. Nest surveys shall be conducted daily between sunrise and 9 a.m. during marine turtle nesting season. No activity shall occur in any location prior to completion of the necessary marine turtle nest survey and protection measures.

d. Nests deposited within the event area shall be marked and left in place unless natural factors threaten the success of the nest. Any nests left in the event area shall be clearly marked and the approximate location of the clutch determined. A circle with a radius of four (4) feet, centered at the clutch, shall be marked by stake and survey tape or string. No activities shall enter this circle and no adjacent activities shall be allowed which might directly or indirectly disturb the area within the staked circle. During marine turtle hatching season (July 1 - October 31), no structures or materials which could impede the progress of turtle hatchlings may remain seaward of a nest overnight. If deposited nests are found on the course we will provide two volunteers equipped with green glow sticks to direct entrants away from that area.

5. No lighting associated with the event is authorized after 9:00 p.m. during the marine turtle nesting season. The only lights utilized are (A) green glow sticks carried by volunteer

course markers and nesting area volunteers; (B) Blue glow sticks at the turnaround point carried by volunteers; (C) Red glow sticks attached to each entrant's rucksack; (D) Red, White & Blue glow sticks attached to six wave banners at the finish line.

6. No water from the structure or event area shall be allowed to run onto the beach where it could impact adjacent sea turtle nests.

7. In the event an unmarked marine turtle nest is exposed, or a dead, injured, or sick marine turtle is discovered during the event, the marine turtle permit holder shall be notified immediately such that appropriate conservation measures can be taken. Within 24 hours of any such occurrence, a report of the incident shall be faxed to the FWC Imperiled Species Management at (850) 921-6988. 8. The permittee shall not disturb existing beach and dune topography and vegetation. No excavation of sand landward of the mean high water line is permitted. Any temporary minor disturbances in the sand (including ruts, depressions, holes, or mounds) shall be filled in and raked smooth with hand tools each evening.
